



Key Accomplishments

- In 2012, Bronx Excellence 1 was the first charter school in the Bronx to earn the National Blue Ribbon award.
- 4 alumni have returned to the Bronx Excellence community as full-time employees.
- Through thoughtful planning and renovation, Bronx Excellence 1 received a Silver Certification in Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design(LEED).
- On May 20, 2021, our CEO, Dr. Charlene Reid, moderated a Mayoral Forum at Bronx excellence 1 discussing topics such as campaign priorities and the city's budget. The event was hosted by the Black Latinx Asian Charter Collaborative (BLACC). Attendees included then NYC Mayoral Candidates Eric Adams and Ray McGuire, as well as the esteemed BLACC Steering Committee, to discuss Black, Latinx, Asian community leadership and empowerment.
- For the first time, all ECS schools currently serve scholars that will be eligible for state exams in 2022.
- Bronx 1 held its second virtual graduation in 2021, graduating 85 scholars. On Saturday, June 25th, 2022, the school will hold an in-person graduation ceremony at Fordham Preparatory School
- Bronx 2 earned the distinction of being a 2019-20 Recognition School by NYSED for high performance on state exams in their inaugural year of testing.
- Bronx Excellence has developed Club Excellence, a co-curricular program which allows scholars to engage in exciting courses that include spoken word, dance, musical theater, computer science, visual arts, fashion history, and African drumming.
- Bronx Excellence continues to partner with Colgate University to host programs and activities that prepare rising 7th-12th grade students for success in and beyond college.
- Through partnerships with Google and Albert Einstein College of Medicine, each year, Bronx Excellence scholars receive mentoring in various STEM-related fields.
 Bronx Excellence 8th graders annually compete at the Annual Urban Advantage Expo at the American Museum of Natural History.
